FERTILISER - MAXIMISING MAIZE YIELD



Maize has a poor tolerance of acidic soils (<pH 5.0) where aluminium toxicity reduces root development and manganese toxicity reduces plant development.

Therefore, achieving the right pH is the first priority. Maintenance of an optimum soil pH ensures nutrients are readily available and maximises growth.

The use of lime to increase soil pH, and gypsum to improve soil structure and calcium saturation, will help to increase maize yield. Good soil structure is essential for strong root development and good growth – maize is particularly sensitive to soil compaction.

Forage maize yield is increased by establishing the correct number of plants to create an efficient green leaf canopy and then maintaining that canopy through to harvest. This requires a balanced crop nutrition programme including all macro and micronutrients. To encourage rapid growth, all phosphate and up to 10–15 kg/ha (8–12 units/acre) of the nitrogen (N) required can be placed below the seed at drilling. The remainder of the N can be top-dressed when the crop emerges. Potash should be applied before seedbed preparation and thoroughly worked in.

Nutrient application rates should be matched to crop requirements to avoid 'nutrient overload', Forage maize yield is influenced by the same nutrients as grain maize, however the difference in nutrient removal between the two types needs to be considered when planning the nutrient programme of the following crop. Surplus nutrients can be lost to the environment via direct run-off into surface water or leaching into groundwater.

GRASSLAND HERBICIDES

Hopefully by the time you are reading this article the new Rinskor-based, clover-safe grassland herbicide, has been approved. It was launched in 2024 in Ireland as Proclova XL and is a valuable addition to the armoury in dock control in grassland. It does not have an under sown cereal approval but has a new sown and established sward rate.

ProGrass has already been approved in the UK and brings together Fluroxypyr and Triclopyr as in Doxstar with Arylex (halauxifen-methyl) which was already widely used in cereals and oilseed rape weed control. It is not clover safe. The addition of Arylex significantly adds to buttercup and cow parsley control over Doxstar. Its weakness is however thistles. Where thistles are a problem in established grass and the sward is to be cut, Thrust (2,4-D + Dicamba) + Gal-Gone (Fluroxypyr) will control docks, thistles and nettles. Interestingly all products are showing better long-term control by adhering to a two-spray approach – year 1 followed by year 2.

DON'T STAGGER INTO SPRING

The reasons why adding sugars to sheep diets is important to get them nutritionally balanced



The last 6-8 weeks before lambing are critical in terms of meeting the high nutritional demands of pregnant ewes in terms of maintaining their body condition and preparing them for lactation. For these reasons feeding energy, sugars and good quality protein in ewe diets is essential in order to maximise milk colostrum quantity and help maintain foetus growth and lamb survival rate.



Molasses is an ideal energy feed for pregnant and lactating ewes from a practical point of view as it is a natural de-duster and there are various ways you can feed it via a TMR, bucket poured onto hay or other forages, through lick wheel feeders or simply blended in home grown cereals.



The sugars in molasses help to promote the cellulolytic bacteria in the rumen, which helps to breakdown forage dry matter and in doing so this helps reduce the chances of rumen acidosis and avoid health issues at lambing.

As Molasses is a liquid a sheep can physically consume approx. 10% more Dry Matter intake per day over a forage based diet which is a significant increase when you consider a ewe's dry matter intake is around 1.5% of its body weight



The sugars in molasses add a natural sweetness to forage based rations that stimulates the taste receptors in the sheep's tongue to want to voluntarily eat more of the ration



In addition to our standard farm molasses products we can supply blends of molasses and glycerol, these are richer in gluconeogenic energy so promoting better health and growth in both lambs and ewes



A farmer in Leyland who is lambing 250 mules on a TMR system reports that adding molasses to his sheep diets has contributed to improvements in both Dry Matter intakes and successful lambing, he comments "Molasses has bought concentrated energy to my TMR which has helped my ewes to milk really well and prevented ration sorting at feeding".
